## THE JESSE TREE

#### What is a Jesse Tree?



A Jesse Tree represents the family tree of Jesus Christ. Each ornament represents a story from the Bible that tells about God's people before Jesus was born. Each Story shows God's salvation plan and tells how He guided humanity to prepare for the coming of the Messiah.

The tradition of the Jesse Tree dates back to the middle ages. The name "Jesse Tree" comes from Isaiah 11:1, "Then a shoot will spring from the stem of Jesse, and a branch from his roots will bear fruit." Jesse is the father of King David. The saviour was to come from David's family line.

#### What is the tradition?

During the Advent season, a Bible Story is read which relates to Jesus' family or God's people. After the Bible story is read and discussed, an ornament is placed on a tree - the Jesse Tree. This was often done from the beginning of Advent to Christmas Day.

#### How to Make Jesse Tree Ornaments

Each day of Advent, many families hang an ornament that symbolises a different story about someone on Jesus's family tree. This popular take on the Jesse Tree Advent tradition helps you trace how God's plan for Jesus to arrive on earth unfolded over many generations. Making your own Jesse Tree ornaments is a great way to deepen your engagement with each Bible story. As you make Jesse Tree ornaments, you'll naturally reflect on the story each ornament symbolizes and how it relates to God's big story.

#### Materials:

- Printer
- Paper/card (8.5" x 11")
- Colouring utensils (markers, crayons, coloured pencils, etc.)
- Scissors
- Twine or ribbon
- A Jesse Tree a tree branch, a felt tree, or a mobile (or a regular Christmas tree!)
- Single hole punch
- (Optional) 25 three-inch blank wood circle ornaments
- (Optional) Glue
- The Jesse Tree Story: A Family Advent Devotional
- 1. Print the ornament patterns
- 2. Colour and decorate your ornaments
- 3. Prepare your ornaments for your tree. Cut out your decorated ornament design.

Then punch a hole in the ornament design for hanging.

Complete your ornament by tying ribbon or twine through the hole and hang it on your Jesse Tree.




