

THE ADVENT WREATH

Advent wreaths are made from evergreen branches arranged in a circle. Every Advent Wreath has four candles. A new candle is lit at Mass each Sunday of Advent, until all candles are lighting on the Fourth Sunday. Some Advent Wreaths have a fifth candle which is lit on Christmas Eve, celebrating the birth of Jesus.

Sometimes Advent is known as a "little Lent", which is why the colour purple is worn by the priests when celebrating Mass. During Lent, we prepare for the resurrection of Jesus at Easter. Similarly, during Advent, we prepare for the coming of Jesus, both at Christmas and we await his second coming.

Each of the candles represents Hope, Peace, Joy, and Faith.


