## **SAMPLE PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL**

*Parishes are invited to select one of more prayers from the samples below.*

### **Celebrant:**

Conscious that each person is precious in the eyes of the Lord, let us place our prayers before God who is kind and merciful, and rich in compassion.

For our community: that we have the strength to stand in solidarity with victims and survivors of abuse, the humility to come to terms with the sinful crimes of the past, and the patience to stop and listen to children and the vulnerable. **Lord, hear us.**

For families: that they may grow stronger and more resilient in their love and care for one another so that children are raised in safe and nurturing environments. **Lord, hear us.**

For those in positions of responsibility: that they may always follow the example of Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd, by treating children and young people with proper respect and care. **Lord, hear us.**

For those whose lives have been traumatised through abuse: that they may find the courage to share their story and to find lasting peace and healing. **Lord, hear us.**

For Church leaders and those entrusted with ministry and pastoral care in the Church: that they will continue to help build stronger faith communities that will promote the safety of children and adults at risk. **Lord, hear us.**

For a spirit of collaboration in our parish which ensures the happiness and confidence of every child, supports safe communities and fosters an environment of protection where children flourish. **Lord, hear us.**

For our Diocese as it seeks to follow the example of Christ and the teachings of his Church: that we will work to ensure that policies and

procedures are implemented to safeguard children and young people.  
**Lord, hear us.**

**Celebrant:**

Gracious and loving God, source of all truth, justice and healing, we implore you to hear the prayers we offer and to look favourably on the prayers of your people. We ask this through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
