1. A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

14:23-29

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not my own, but that of the Father who sent me. "I have told you these things while I am still with you. However, the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you.

"Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled; be not afraid. "You have heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I will come back to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it does happen you may believe.

2. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, 'Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth.' But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also. And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well. If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles. Give to the one who asks you, and do not turn away from the one who wants to borrow from you.

"You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbour and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

- 2. God of all nations, guide governments across the world as they respond in ways that support the legitimate rights of all, especially those who are most vulnerable, those who are dispossessed, those denied their basic human rights, and those who fear for their safety. Lord, hear us.
- 3. God of mercy and compassion, bestow your peace on the people of the Middle East. Turn hatred into love, fear into trust, despair into hope, occupation to liberation, and oppression to freedom. Lord, hear us.
- God of the vulnerable, we pray for the children of this conflict, the elderly and infirm, and those held hostage. Return them to the refuge and safety of their families where they will experience protection and healing. Lord, hear us.
- 5. God of hope, we pray for the churches of Gaza, may they offer refuge to the many who are displaced, frightened, distressed and abandoned. May their compassion and love provide sanctuary and shelter to all in need. Lord, hear us.
- God of all-providence, open corridors of hope and relief to the people of Gaza. Provide urgent provisions of food, water, and medical supplies for the innocent embroiled in this conflict and for those unable to leave Gaza. Lord, hear us.
- 7. God of peace, we pray for an end to all acts of terrorism and conflict. Restrain the hostility of warring factions, and may they pursue the paths of justice, peace, and reconciliation. Lord, hear us.

8. God of healing, bring comfort to those who are grieving the death of their loved ones. Heal the broken hearted and console them in their grief. Lord, hear us.

For all who suffer because of the war and violence in Gaza and Israel, that they might find hope in people's efforts to bring Christ's peace to the world. Lord, hear us.

We pray that we might become peace-makers with our families, our neighbours and communities. Lord, hear us.

REFLECTION

MOTHER TERESA REFLECTS ON WORKING TOWARD PEACE

The fruit of silence is prayer; the fruit of prayer is faith; the fruit of faith is love; the fruit of love is service; the fruit of service is peace.

Let us not use bombs and guns to overcome the world. Let us use love and compassion. Peace begins with a smile. Smile five times a day at someone you don't really want to smile at; do it for peace. Let us radiate the peace of God and so light His light and extinguish in the world and in the hearts of all men all hatred and love for power.

Today, if we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten that we belong to each other-that man, that woman, that child is my brother or my sister. If everyone could see the image of God in his neighbour, do you think we would still need tanks and generals?

Peace and war begin at home. If we truly want peace in the world, let us begin by loving one another in our own families. If we want to spread joy, we need for every family to have joy.

Today, nations put too much effort and money into defending their borders. They know very little about the poverty and the suffering that exist in the countries where those bordering on destitution live. If they would only defend these defenceless people with food, shelter, and clothing, I think the world would be a happier place.
