


Who is John the Baptist?






• When Mary was pregnant, she visited her cousin Elizabeth, and John the Baptist leapt with joy in Elizabeth's womb as he recognised in Mary's womb Jesus, the Saviour of the world.

• The name "John" was given to Elizabeth's child by an angel sent by God.



- It is commonly believed that John was the second cousin of Jesus.
- John lived in the desert wearing camel hair and feeding on locusts and wild honey until the beginning of his ministry. (Mt. 3:4)
- John baptized Jewish people in the river Jordan calling them to repentance and confessing their sins.
- John pointed Jesus out when he said, 'Look! There is the Lamb of God who is to take away the sins of the world.' (Jn. 1:29)
 - When John was asked if he was the Messiah? He said, 'I am not the Messiah, but I have been sent ahead of him. He must increase, but I must decrease.' (Jn.3:28,30)
 - According to the Gospels in the New Testament, John baptized Jesus in the river Jordan. Jesus' baptism then started the beginning of His ministry.
 - Herodias asked for the head of John the Baptist on a platter, and sadly her wish was granted, and he was beheaded in 31AD.
 - John the Baptist has two feast days: His birth (Nativity) on 24th June and his martyrdom on 29th August.



"After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, saying, 'This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased; Listen to him'"

(Mt 3:16-17).

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord celebrates the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist. We know that — since Jesus was born without sin — he did not really need to be baptized. And yet, Jesus welcomes his own baptism as an example for the rest of us and as a sign of his true identity. He is God's son, the living presence of God on earth. When we renew our baptismal promises, we proclaim our belief in the waters of baptism and our new and ongoing life in Jesus Christ.

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

When we enter a church or leave our homes, we usually dip our hand into a holy water font and bless ourselves with the Sign of the Cross: "In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen." On the day of our Baptism, while the priest poured water on us three times, he stated, "[Name], I baptize you, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Through Baptism, we became Christians, followers of Jesus Christ. This holy water cleanses, renews, and refreshes us along our Christian journey. The Sign of the Cross is a mark of the One to whom we belong — the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—the Trinity. By dipping our hand into the holy water and blessing ourselves, we symbolically renew the promises made at our baptism to live as faithful followers of Jesus Christ. (See below)
