

PREPARATORY SUGGESTIONS

Celebrating Eucharist at the beginning of the new school year may be an opportunity to symbolically draw the school community together focusing on symbols/themes that reflect each year group as they embark on the new school year together.

Col. 3:12-17, 23,24

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Colossians.

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER FOR CHILDREN III

Yes, Lord, you are holy; you are kind to us and to all. For this we thank you.
We thank you above all for your Son, Jesus Christ.

You sent him into this world because people had turned away from you and no longer loved each other. He opened our eyes and our hearts to understand that we are brothers and sisters and that you are Father of us all.

He now brings us together to one table and asks us to do what he did.

Father, we ask you to bless ✠ these gifts of bread and wine and make them holy. Change them for us into the body and blood of Jesus Christ, your Son. On the night before he died for us, he had supper for the last time with his disciples. He took bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread and gave it to his friends, saying:

FOR THIS IS MY BODY WHICH WILL BE GIVEN UP FOR YOU.**

ETERNAL COVENANT WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND
FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS.**
